ANIMAL RESCUE OPERATIONS

POTENTIAL FOR OVER **5,000** HOMES TO HAVE ANIMALS

PETS RESCUED: 1,143

OVER **400** PETS FED AND WATERED IN THEIR HOMES

REUNITED **90%** OF PETS WITH FAMILIES

75 ANIMALS WERE ADOPTED BY NEW FAMILIES




