
If you, or someone you know, is being sexually exploited, call the Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-387-KIDS (5437) or call your local police department.

The law – Protection of Sexually Exploited
Children Act – recognizes that the sexual exploitation
and human trafficking of children and youth
under 18 is sexual abuse which is a crime.
Those who are victims of this abuse can
receive help and protection.

Support services include a safe place to stay and get healthy, and people who will listen and not judge while they help you get back to a safe life.







- When you trade sex for money or things, you will keep all of it.

## Think about it

- sooner or later you have to pay back the person who is giving you money, clothes, drinks, drugs or anything else.
- if someone tells you to send pictures of yourself on your phone or the internet, those pictures never go away and can be shared with people you don't know.



People who trade sex for money are being sexually exploited and will likely stop seeing the money they are promised.

If you trade sex for money you may be forced to have unprotected sex and you are more likely to catch Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs). If you are a girl you can end up pregnant. Anyone who trades sex for money can be exposed to violence and dangerous situations that could kill you.


If someone is taking the money you make from having sex with strangers, that person is a pimp. You may think that he or she is looking out for you, but they are not. They are sexually exploiting you.

Both adults and teens may try to get kids to trade sex in exchange for money or things.

There is help. In Alberta, the Protection for Sexually Exploited Children's Act (PSECA) is a law that lets Children's Services and community agencies help children and youth who are sexually exploited.

If you're being sexually exploited you have done nothing wrong and will not get in trouble. You are the victim of a crime of sexual abuse and there are people who want to help you.
