#### Team Alberta wins Centennial Cup at the 2022 Canada Summer Games

Team Alberta was thrilled to receive the Centennial Cup at the 2022 Canada Summer Games. The Cup is presented to the province showing the greatest improvement in the final standings compared to the previous Canada Games (summer-to-summer and winter to winter).

Alberta also won this award at the 2019 Canada Winter Games in Red Deer.

Team Alberta finished fourth overall at the 2022 Canada Summer Games with 111 medals: 35 Gold, 33 Silver and 43 Bronze. Leading the team to this impressive finish was swimming with 42 medals and Athletics with 33 medals.

# Canadian Women & Sport – Same Game Challenge

<u>Same Game Challenge</u> is for sport leaders who are inspired to reimagine how women and girls access their sport but have been frustrated in their ability to make efficient and effective change. Sport leaders will be provided with a step-by-step process that guides them on how to connect with their members to identify gender inequities.

Canadian Women & Sport and Canadian Tire Jumpstart are partnering to deliver five cohorts to reach 240 organizations for the Same Game Challenge, which will offer sport, physical activity, and recreation organizations across Canada more opportunities to participate.

Applications for this first cohort are open from Thursday, September 1 until end of day Sunday, October 2. Same Game Challenge will officially begin in January 2023 and will run until July 2023.

#### **Natural Infrastructure Fund**

On July 14, 2022, Infrastructure Canada launched the Natural Infrastructure Fund – Small Projects Stream. Applications for this stream will be accepted until September 27, 2022.

The Natural Infrastructure Fund is open to the following recipients:

- municipalities, local, or regional governments; provinces and territories; Indigenous recipients (Indigenous governing bodies, not-for-profits whose primary mandate is to serve Indigenous Peoples, and not-for-profit Indigenous development corporations);
- public sector bodies established by a provincial or territorial statute, a regulation, or wholly owned by a provincial, territorial, municipal, or regional government;
- $\bullet\,$  not-for-profit organizations federally or provincially incorporated; and
- private for-profit organizations working in collaboration with another eligible public recipient.
